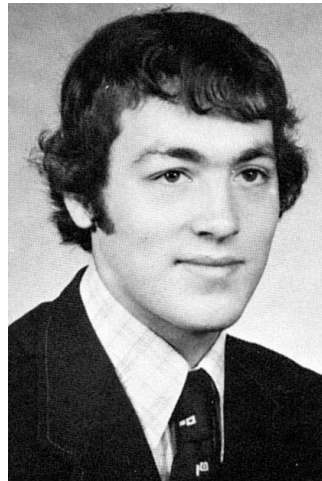
Mark A. Hatlestad Obituary:

Tammy said of her father, "Dad would always make fun out of ordinary things. He'd make a weekday lunch exciting by buying a few pull-tabs and winning \$100!"

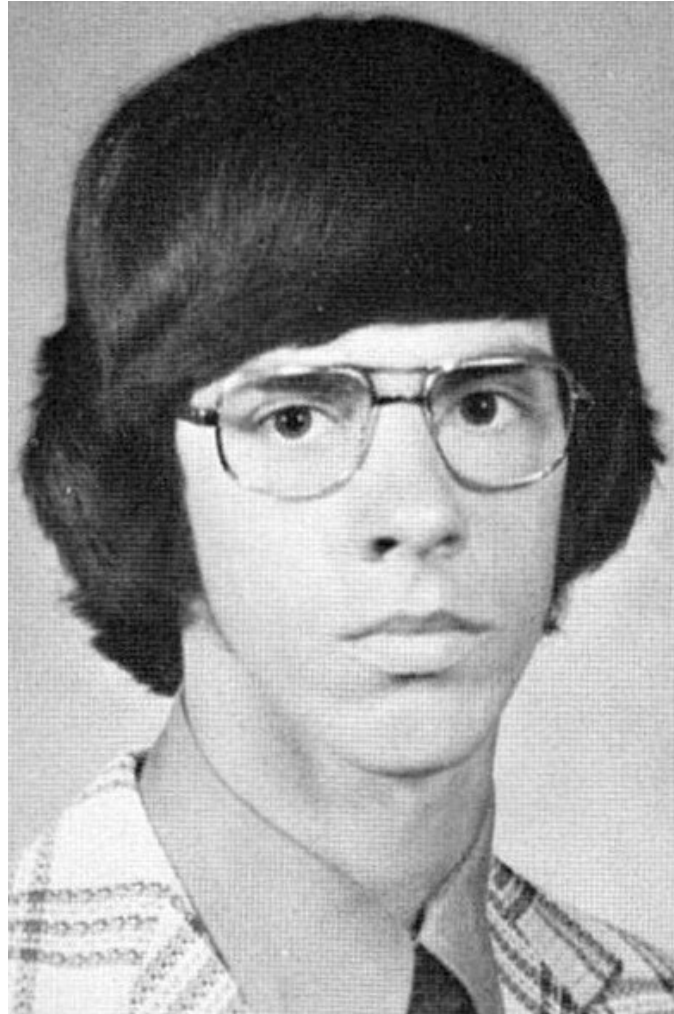

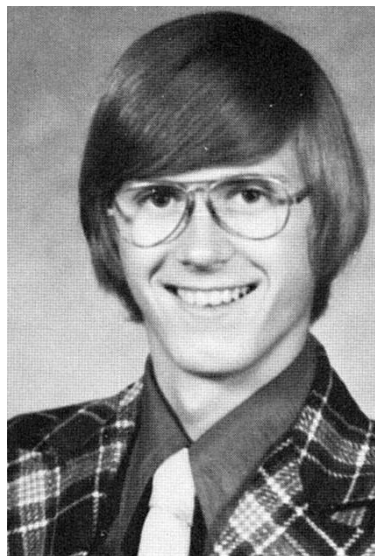
On April 14, 2007, Beverly was united in marriage to Wendell Ehlers, at St. John's Lutheran Church in Plato, MN.

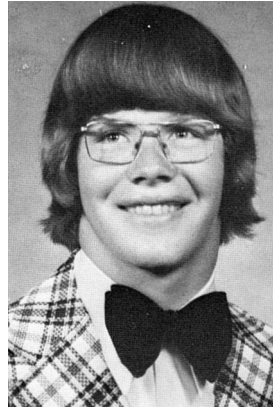


I retired at sixty two after working for the Navistar International Truck dealership in Glencoe for forty four years. The last thirty two years as the parts department manager for four different owners.

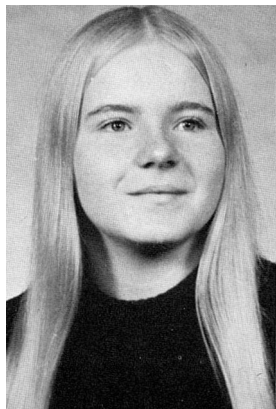


50 years is a long time, but where did it go?

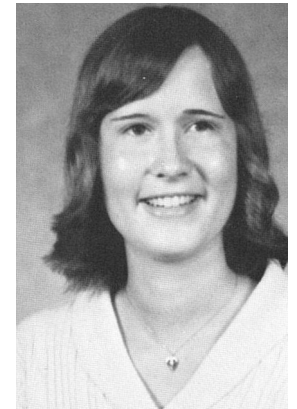
I hope to always remain strong: physically, mentally, emotionally and spiritually.

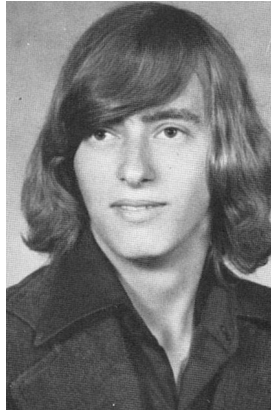

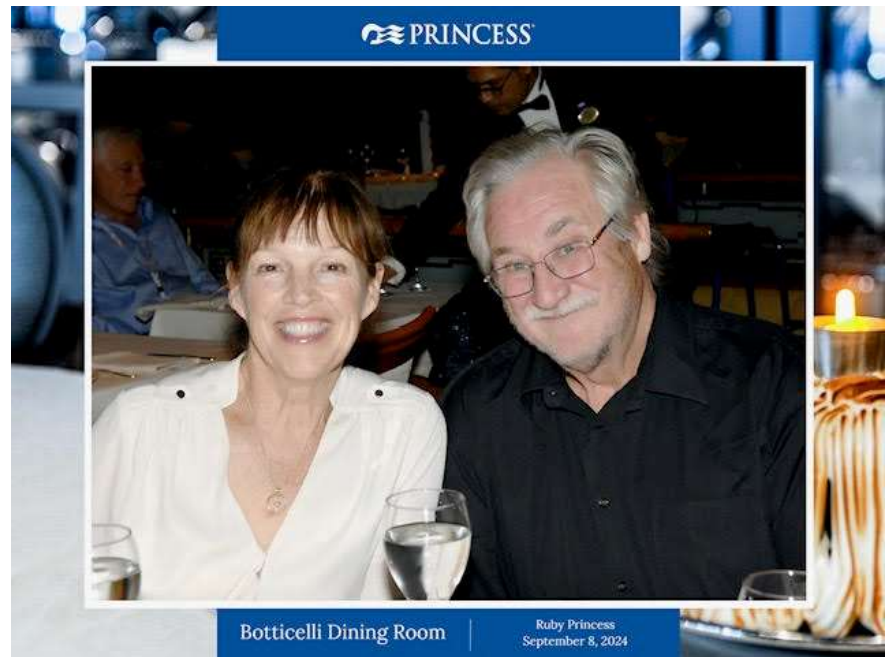

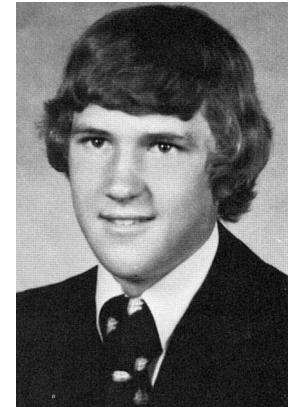


Maureen (Walton) McGough
